The FASD ASSESSMENT: WHAT DOES IT MEAN?



Below is a brief breakdown of the brain assessment areas that are tested by a physician/ pediatrician, psychologist, speech language pathologist and occupational therapist



- **Academic Achievement**: reading, math, comprehen- 8. sion
- **Attention:** ability to stay focused, for example, in a classroom setting
- Cognition: reasoning, problem solving, planning, 3. and IQ (intelligence quotient)
- Language: receptive language (ability to under-4. stand what is said to them) and expressive language (ability to clearly communicate to others)
- Memory: short and long-term memory, working memory
- Neuroanatomy/Neurophysiology: head size, and other disorders related to the nervous system (i.e. seizures)
- Executive Functioning: problem solving, planning, organizing, understanding of consequences, impulsive behavior and hyperactivity, abstract concepts such as time and money

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- Adaptive Behaviours, Social Skills and Social Communication: understanding of personal boundaries, social vulnerability, behaving younger than actual age
- Motor Skills: balance, strength, coordination, reflexes and muscle tone; will ask whether your child has reached developmental milestones on time (i.e. crawling, walking, grasping objects)
- 10. **Affect Regulation:** ability to control emotions and display appropriate emotional responses
- 11. Trauma History: history of any traumas experienced, for example physical or emotional abuse
- 12. **Sensory Issues:** ability to process information that comes in through the senses
